Delgado has been with Goodwill for 10 years, previously serving as Vice President of Mission and Education Initiatives and Executive Director of The Excel Center®, Goodwill's school for adult learners, from 2011 to 2013.

Delgado earned an EMBA from the University of Notre Dame and possesses a bachelor of arts in English and education from the University of North Dakota. In 2015, Delgado was named an Ascend Fellow at the Aspen Institute, an educational and policy studies organization based in Washington, D.C. As an Ascend Fellow, she works with leaders across the nation to improve the lives of low-income families on a national scale.

Goodwill's mission and education division includes [The Excel Center](#), a network of public high schools for adult learners that provides over 4,200 Hoosiers the opportunity to earn a Core 40 diploma, industry certifications and college credits every year, all at no cost, and [Nurse-Family Partnership®](#), a community health program that pairs mothers pregnant with their first child with a registered nurse for ongoing home visits aimed at supporting mothers and families in providing the very best start for their children during the earliest, most developmentally critical years.

“Goodwill imagines a future where any family can access high-quality education and supportive services that empower them to increase their independence, attain meaningful employment and reach their full potential,” said Delgado.
